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What are Hazardous Materials?

When most people think of "hazardous materials" they picture leaking drums full of oozing green chemicals that eat away flesh or change people into super heroes.



Yet every home can be a warehouse of hazardous materials. Cleansers, oils, paints, batteries, medicines, pesticides and common household items hold the distinction of being "hazardous". The average household contains between 3 and 10 gallons of materials that are classified as dangerous goods.

What is a Professional?

A **professional** is a [person](#) in a [profession](#) that requires certain types of skilled work requiring formal [training](#) or [education](#). In western nations, such as the United States, the term commonly describes highly educated, mostly salaried workers, who enjoy considerable work autonomy, economic security, a comfortable salary, and are commonly engaged in creative and intellectually challenging work. A professional athlete is someone who derives [income](#) by participating in competitive sports. Sometimes the term is also used to indicate a level of quality of [goods](#) or [tools](#), sometimes also called "commercial grade".

How do Professionals Work?

- A professional is a worker required to possess a large body of knowledge derived from extensive academic study (usually [tertiary](#)), with the training almost always formalized. Professionals are at least to a degree self-regulating, in that they control the training and evaluation processes that admit new persons to the field, and in judging whether the work done by their members is up to standard. This differs from other kinds of work where [regulation](#) (if considered necessary) is imposed by the state, or where official [quality standards](#) are often lacking. Professions have some historical links to [guilds](#) in these regards.
- Professionals usually exercise autonomy in the workplace, and are expected to utilize their independent judgement and professional ethics in carrying out their responsibilities. This holds true even if they are [employees](#) instead of working on their own. Typically a professional provides a service (in exchange for [payment](#) or [salary](#)), in accordance with established protocols for licensing, ethics, procedures, standards of service and training / certification.

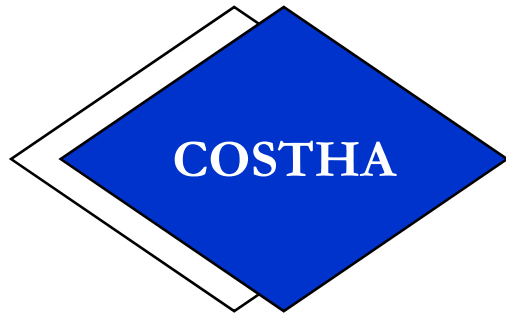


How do I become a licensed Florida cosmetologist?

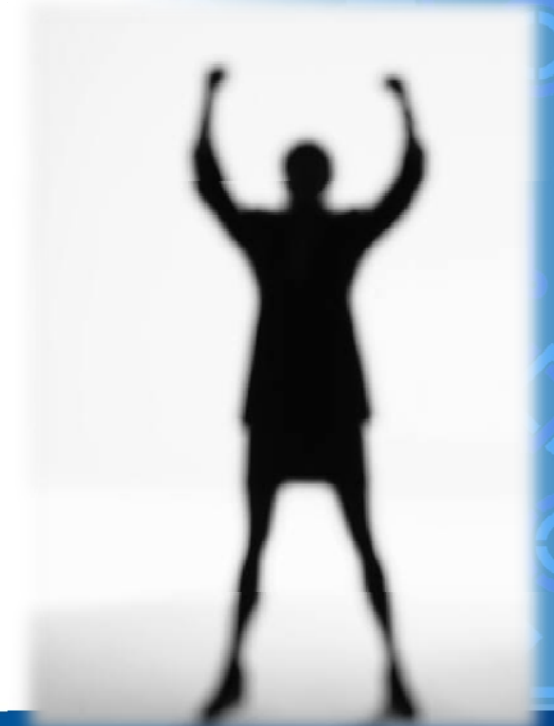
To become a licensed cosmetologist in the State of Florida you must attend a Florida school of cosmetology and successfully complete a minimum of 1,200 hours of education. Upon the successful completion of the educational hours, a completed cosmetology examination application should be submitted to the department along with the applicable fees. Once the examination application has been approved, you will receive written notification from the department's examination vendor, Pearson VUE, to schedule a date and time for your written cosmetology examination. After successfully passing both portions of the cosmetology examination, you will be issued a cosmetology license.
